


2021 REAR COMMODORE—DALE PITCHER





DOCK BIDDING

Dock Bidding is something that up until 2015 was generally a non-issue at the first General Meeting of the year. However, in recent years KYC has welcomed new members to the club, as well as members purchasing bigger and wider boats, creating a difficult situation for the Fleet Captain (**Rick Banman**) who was in charge of making everyone happy with the dock assignment. Kudos go out to Rick for looking after this very complex procedure. Unfortunately Happy was not always the case and the new the **Fleet Captain**, again finds a number of members looking to participate in the Dock Bidding Process as many of the docks had been assigned on a temporary basis. The following is a Question and Answer overview which I trust will aid existing members looking to move, along with recent new members looking to be assigned a permanent dock. I trust this helps make the process a smooth operation and that at the end of the day everyone is happy.

THE FOLLOWING Q & A WILL HOPEFULLY AID IN THE UNDERSTANDING OF HOW THE "DOCK BIDDING" PROCESS WORKS

- **HOW DO I KNOW WHICH DOCKS WILL BE AVAILABLE TO BID ON?** The Fleet Captain will advise the paid up membership as to which docks are available in the notice of the Spring General Meeting. (Section 3 Rule 3.5b)
- **HOW IS SENIORITY DETERMINED?** This is based on the date on your initial membership cheque. A listing of Seniority has been mailed out to all members.
- **CAN A MEMBER BID BY PROXY?** Yes proxy bids are acceptable. (Rue 3.5G)
- **WHICH DOCKS ARE OPEN FOR BIDDING?** 1) Docks that are vacant because members have left the club, b) docks that were assigned mid-season in the preceding year to new member(s), c) docks left vacant by a full or probationary member who during the dock bidding procedure successfully bids on another dock.
- **WHAT IS THE BIDDING ORDER?** By seniority of membership provided that the size and draft of the member's boat are appropriate to the size of the dock available. (see KYC Rules/Regulations 3.5e)
- **CAN PROBATIONARY MEMBERS BID ON A DOCK?** Yes, at the annual spring dock bidding, in accordance with seniority. A dock thus acquired 'belongs' to that member until he/she chooses to bid on a different dock.
- **WHAT ABOUT NEW MEMBERS?** Members who join during the boating season are assigned a temporary dock by the Fleet Captain — if a suitable dock is available.
- **DOES THE TEMPORARY DOCK ASSIGNED TO A MEMBER WHO JOINS MID-SEASON 'BELONG' TO THAT MEMBER OR IS THAT DOCK OPEN FOR BIDDING THE FOLLOWING YEAR?** It is open for bidding the following year.
- **WHO HAS THE FINAL SAY?** According to KYC Rules/Regulations, Section 3.5g Dock Bidding and Assignments the Fleet Captain may assign docks if necessary after completion of dock bidding.



2021 TREASURER - RICHARD JUKER

In June of this year the club was in a pinch for a Treasurer with the departure of Jeanette from KYC. On kind of a combination basis of volunteer/voluntold, I agreed to step in until the end of our fiscal year. The position of Treasurer sure kept me busy! 
RICK & DONNA BANMAN

The **Advisory Board** now consists of **Ken Gifford, Gerry Goodhue, Kristie Beattie** and **Brian Knowles**.



A By-law change was unanimously approved and the revision of the KYC By-laws will be addressed in the spring 2022.
